

Academic Excellence

We are committed to providing an academically challenging K-8 program. For the past 5 years, school-wide average scores on the SAT-10 (a nationally standardized test) have consistently ranked in the top 25-30% of students tested nationwide. Last year, our 8th grade class scored in the 88th percentile - the top 12% nationwide. As part of our continuing commitment to academic excellence, we have implemented monthly math and reading assessments (DIBELS) to help track individual student progress and develop individualized learning programs. We have added new spelling and reading levels in K-4 to challenge more advanced students. The new Mid-high Honors curriculum allows students to take language arts and math classes one grade level above their "social" grade. Later this year, we look forward to participating in three academic competitions – spelling bee, geography bee and science fair.

Spiritual Excellence

We endeavor to equip students with a deep understanding of Scripture to apply in their daily lives. Our theme for this year is "Light", and each week we are seeing the blessings of kids who are shining brightly to the world. Kids are reciting verses and God is being honored. The recent Spiritual Emphasis Camp for our 7th and 8th graders was held at UCYC. The theme was being "all in for God". Students explored their commitment to Christ and examined things that hinder them in their Christian walk. Students came away with a deeper commitment in their faith.

Social Excellence

We emphasize the importance of giving back to the community, and CAP students have participated in numerous service activities, including the Radio Shine Together Rally, the Open Door Mission clothing drive, and the November food drive. Mid-High students have already completed over 400 hours of community service!

We nurture well-rounded kids with art, music, PE and computer classes. This year, CAP kids won three "Best in Show" awards at the County Art Fair, and our Girls' Volleyball team beat the #3 seed in regional competition.

We also nurture well-mannered and responsible kids. Our student handbook was updated in June to clarify behavioral expectations. Our teachers ensure consistent enforcement of these policies in the classroom and on the playground.
